



MEMORIAL PARK REDEVELOPMENT

Following an extensive period of community consultation, Council considered the 44 responses received in relation to the draft Concept Plan for the redevelopment of Memorial Park. The key elements of the feedback which will inform the final outcome include:

Rotunda: the rotunda was seen as an important element of the Park to retain, with approximately 68% of responses expressing either a desire or strong preference to maintain this structure as is. The revised Concept Plan shows the retention of the rotunda, with the only modification being a pathway around the structure.

Playgrounds/ Adventure Playspaces: following consideration of the comments to maintain the memorial space around the rotunda, and to reduce the density of the play/adventure spaces within the original concept, the pump track and skatepark have been removed from the Plan, with the potential for these to be located elsewhere within the townsite at a later date. Additional playspaces in accordance with the original concept will be situated behind the Old Courthouse, and adjacent to the existing playground. The recent tourism workshop captured the important role of playspaces to enhance the visitor's experience in the Pingelly CBD.

Closure of Scudds Lane: no concerns were raised in relation to the linking of the eastern and western areas of Memorial Park that are currently segregated by Scudds Lane. This aspect of the Plan will allow the play area to flow into the passive recreational spaces.

Toilets: 17 responses specifically supported toilets within the Precinct, while 6 suggested the toilets at the Town Hall are adequate for the area. Toilets were considered to be a key factor of the success of the precinct, to ensure young children do not need to cross Parade Street to access facilities, and to allow parents to provide adequate supervision during the use of the Park.

A funding submission will now be prepared in accordance with the revised outcomes, and further information and opportunities for community input will be provided upon notification of funding success.
