The Study

The Shire of Pingelly commissioned CATALYSE® to conduct an independent MARKYT® Community Scorecard.

All community members were invited to take part. Scorecard invitations were sent to all households and residential PO Boxes in the Shire of Pingelly using Australia Post's unaddressed mail services. Respondents could complete the scorecard in hard copy or online.

CATALYSE® sent email invitations to the Shire of Pingelly's customer contacts, and the Shire provided supporting promotions through various communication channels. The scorecard was open from 9 to 25 March 2022.








The scorecard was completed by **108 community members** with various connections to the Shire:






There are two dimensions. The vertical axis maps community perceptions of performance for individual measures. The horizontal axis maps performance relative to the MARKYT® Industry Standards.







Other suggestions (mentioned by 1% or fewer people) included access to unused buildings in Parade Street, a streetscape program, maintenance of refuse site, water conversation for ovals and parks, maintain medical services, historical records, directional signage, green waste collection, maintenance of parks and gardens, raking playground sand daily, electric car charging stations, a police station, Aboriginal housing, and schooling opportunities.





How the community is consulted on local issues







































How your local town centre is being developed and activated






