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RAV Network 4 Access

The following roads have recently been given RAV Network 4 access:

Belt Road & Kerr Road

- Low Volume Type A—Maximum speed 40km/h
- Headlights must be switched on at all times
- When travelling at night, the RAV must travel at a maximum speed of 40km/h and display amber flashing warning light on the prime mover
- Direct radio contact must be maintained with other restricted access vehicles to establish their position on or near the road (suggested UHF channel 40)

Thompson Road & Norm Road

- Low Volume Type A—Maximum speed 60km/h
- Headlights must be switched on at all times
- When travelling at night, the RAV must travel at a maximum speed of 40km/h and display amber flashing warning light on the prime mover
- Direct radio contact must be maintained with other restricted access vehicles to establish their position on or near the road (suggested UHF channel 40)

Key West Road

- Low Volume Type A—Maximum speed 80km/h
- Headlights must be switched on at all times
- When travelling at night, the RAV must travel at a maximum speed of 40km/h and display amber flashing warning light on the prime mover
- Direct radio contact must be maintained with other restricted access vehicles to establish their position on or near the road (suggested UHF channel 40)

Ryan Road

- Maximum speed 80km/h

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Works Update

- The Parks & Gardens Team have commenced weed spraying of laneways. The spraying of verges will commence on the 15th of July. Residents who do not want their verge sprayed need to contact the Shire on 9887 1066.
- Main Roads contractors have painted the centre line on Review Street.
- The timber bridge structure at Bridge No 3097 on Bullaring Road has been removed. Contractors have completed the concrete work. Earthworks to reinstate the road will be finished next week. The project was scheduled for completion by late-June however due to delays the project will be completed in July. Motorists are advised the gravel side track is open and to follow signage and speed limits set. A lighting tower is being used to illuminate the site at night. This work is fully funded by Main Roads WA for Shires that have a compliant bridge maintenance program.
- Traffic hazard signage is in place on Aldersyde Road east of Powell Road to warn motorists of a road failure.
- A grave will be prepared for a funeral at Pingelly Cemetery next Friday.
- Winter maintenance grading work has been carried out on the following roads. Red Hill, Avery South, Kulyaling West.
- Storm damage repair work on Jingaring Road has been completed. Five roads on the western side of Pingelly still need drainage repair work done to finalise the WANDRRA claim.
- Measuring for some new rural road numbers was carried out on Thursday.
- Traffic counters have been installed at Fairhead, Brains & Hastings Roads.

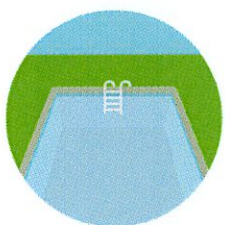

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Did you Know?



Anyone can report a faulty street light? All residents can report faulty street lights. The reporting process is quick and easy. Reports need to be made directly to Western Power, not to the Shire. The only information Western Power requires to repair the street light is the street that it is on, the nearest house number or the pole number. If you need to report a faulty street light, please contact western power on 1800 622 008.

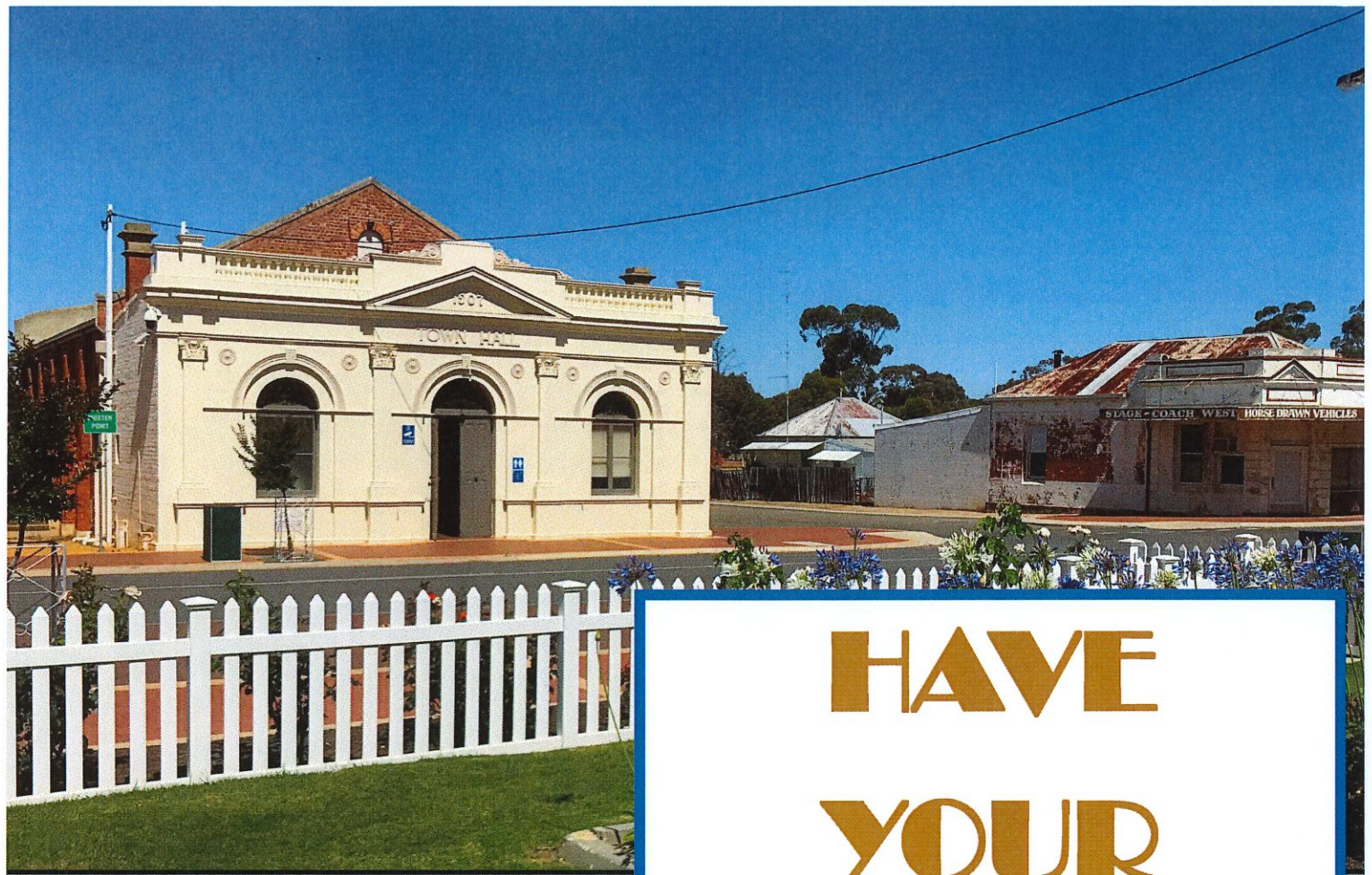


Any pool with a water depth of 300mm (30cm) or capable of holding more than 300mm of water is required by law to have an approved fence erected to protect children from drowning.

Local Government is empowered to issue infringements or penalties for non-compliance. It is the responsibility of the owner/occupier to ensure that a compliant barrier is maintained in a functional condition at all times.



Rates are an annual payment made by residents for living in a Local Government area. Rates are in effect as a way of paying for the delivery of vital community services and infrastructure for example, roads, footpaths, parks, libraries and swimming pools. The amount you pay in rates each year depends on the basis of valuation applied to your property. This valuation is determined by the Valuer General's Office, an independent State Government organisation and not the Shire of Pingelly. Based on the valuation that is carried out, your rates are then calculated each year and an annual rate notice is issued to you. More detailed information about property valuations is available from Landgate.
