1 Chat with us first
We encourage you to us to discuss your project idea.

2 Complete the form
Download the application form from the Shire of Pingelly website and return it by 4pm on the closing date.

3 Get notified
Successful applicatns will be contacted by email.

ACQUITTAL ...

Grant recipients must:

- Submit receipts, invoices, and a brief evaluation report
- Provide this documentation within 30 days of the project's completion

Important: If you don't complete the acquittal, you won't be eligible for future funding.

WHO CAN APPLY?



Eligible applicants include:

- Individuals
- Clubs or community organisations
- Local businesses
- You are not eligible if:
 - You (or your organisation) haven't completed a previous grant
 - You (or your organisation) have already received the maximum funding from the Community & Events Grant Scheme in the same financial year

WHAT CAN I APPLY FOR?

You can apply for up to \$3,000 per financial year.

Funding will cover up to 75% of your total project costs.

In-kind support and volunteer labour can be included as part of your total project costs.

Applications must come from eligible applicants.

TARGET AREAS

Grants are available for projects and programs that:

- Take place within the Shire of Pingelly, or
- Provide a clear benefit to residents or visitors of the Shire.

Projects should align with a target area from the Shire's Community Strategic Plan, which may include (but are not limited to):

- Public Events
- Capacity Building
- Supporting Young People
- Supporting Elderly
- Health & Wellbeing
- Cultural Diversity & Inclusion
- Developing & Attracting Art Projects
- Community Strength & Cohesion
- Promote Heritage & Tourism
- Activate Local Businesses

ASSESSMENT

- Benefit to the community**
How much the project will help or improve the community.
- Identified need**
Whether the project clearly responds to a real, demonstrated need.
- Community involvement**
Including partnerships, collaboration and local engagement.
- Ability to deliver**
Whether the applicant has the skills and resources to carry out the project successfully.
