

Tender for the sale of scrap metal – Pingelly Refuse Site

1. Scope

This specification covers the sale and removal of scrap metal stockpiled at the Pingelly Waste Management Facility. The objective is to ensure compliance with environmental, safety, and legal requirements while maximizing resource recovery.

2. Location

Site: Pingelly Waste Management Facility

Address: 2 km south of Pingelly townsite, off Great Southern Highway

Operating Hours: Saturday–Monday, 7:30 AM – 4:00 PM

3. Material Description

Type: Ferrous and non-ferrous scrap steel (from general waste, appliances, fencing, and construction materials)

Condition: Mixed grades, that may include rusted or painted steel

Estimated Quantity: To be confirmed by site inspection

4. Compliance Requirements

Tenderers must adhere to the following conditions:

- **Licensing:** Hold a valid scrap metal dealer license or an Australian Business Number (ABN).
- **Transaction Records:** Maintain accurate records including:
 - Buyer identification
 - Vehicle registration details
 - Date and time of collection
- **Payment Terms:** All payments must be made via electronic funds transfer or cheque. Cash payments are strictly prohibited under WA scrap metal regulations.
- **Environmental & Safety Measures:** All loading and removal activities must be conducted in a manner that prevents:
 - Soil contamination

- Spillage of materials
- Fire hazards

5. Safety & Environmental Conditions

No burning or cutting on-site without Shire approval.

Liquids, oils, and hazardous residues must be removed before collection.

Transport vehicles must comply with WA road safety and load restraint requirements.

6. Sale Method

Process: RFQ

Award Basis: Highest price per tonne, compliance with conditions, and ability to remove material within agreed timeframe.

7. Removal & Transport

The Buyer is responsible for loading, transport, and leaving the site clean.
