



## HAVE YOUR SAY: MEMORIAL PARK REDEVELOPMENT DRAFT CONCEPT PLAN

Thankyou to the community for the fantastic number of responses received so far about the Concept Plan! The feedback submitted will be compiled for Council to consider prior to setting the direction for this project.

The aim of the redevelopment is to create vibrant and welcoming place for residents and visitors to meet, rest and play; while supporting our local businesses to be the very best they can be. Memorial Park is within a 800m walking and 1.5km cycling catchment for the majority of residents to access, while remaining highly visible to pass-through traffic to foster an spectacular first impression of Pingelly.

The project will add to the vibrancy of the Pingelly Town Centre, and facilitate economic and social recovery following COVID-19 by:

- Creating local jobs during and after construction
- Sourcing materials locally to build and maintain the space
- Encouraging new spending opportunities in our CBD by developing an attractive stopover for pass-through traffic
- Providing a dynamic space for local families, children and young people to remain socially engaged and physically active
- Supporting community groups to activate the town with a purpose-built space for events
- Improving access and amenity for senior residents using the park

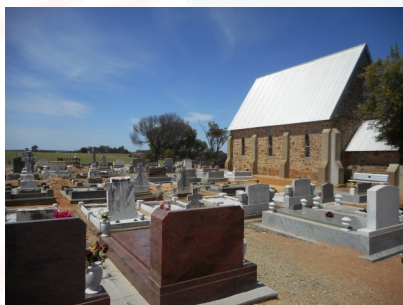
