



MEMORIAL PARK REDEVELOPMENT



The Memorial Park Redevelopment has continued to run smoothly with minimal disruptions due to concrete and supply issues attributed by the volume of COVID-19 recovery projects taking place across the state.

The past fortnight has seen the installation of concrete paths, the spinner play device, shade structures, rubber softfall, turf sand and plumbing.



During the next fortnight irrigation, plumbing and electrical works will continue. In addition, the final park furniture and play equipment will be installed, along with the toilet block, turf and fencing.

This project has been made possible through the Drought Communities Programme Funding provided by the Commonwealth Government.

Buildings Asset Management Plan

Council adopted its Building Asset Management Plan. This plan contains an inventory of assets owned by the Shire, a minimum standard required, the risks associated with these assets and the renewal costs for the buildings over the next 20 years.

Council endorsed the calling for Expressions of Interest to lease the Pingelly Old Court House.

Council endorsed the advertising of the Draft Pingelly Youth Strategy 2021-25 for public comment.

Appointment of New Chief Executive Officer

Council approved the appointment of Mr Andrew Dover to the position of Chief Executive Officer for a period of 3 years. Mr Dover will commence on Tuesday 3 August 2021.

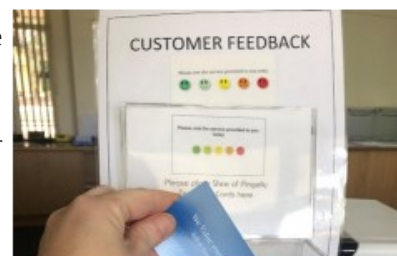

OLD COURTHOUSE LEASE OPPORTUNITY EXPRESSION OF INTEREST

The Shire of Pingelly is seeking Expressions of Interest for a unique tenancy opportunity. The Shire is specifically seeking EOI's from those in the arts, culture, tourism or hospitality industries which can deliver an outcome within the Old Courthouse building, that is complementary to the Memorial Park Precinct redevelopment and aligns with the Shire's vision of increasing tourism visitation and experiences, by transforming Pingelly into a must-visit destination.

The surrounding historical buildings and parkland already host cultural and commercial activities. These include a contemporary art gallery, museum, tourist information space, public event space, small business precinct, and areas for passive recreation.

The Memorial Park Precinct features an all ages children's playground which attracts locals and visitors from across the region. A redevelopment of the Precinct valued at \$1m, is set to be completed in July 2021.

In order to obtain a tenant that is highly advantageous to the area, the Shire of Pingelly is offering the tenancy for the initial 3 years, at the cost of outgoings only. Outgoings (Shire rates, water rates, Emergency Services Levy, building insurance) are anticipated to be approximately \$265 per month. Other costs that should be included when preparing a proposal include (but are not limited to) commercial rubbish and utilities.

DRAFT PINGELLY YOUTH STRATEGY 2021-25 NOW AVAILABLE FOR PUBLIC COMMENT

The Shire of Pingelly, in collaboration with the Pingelly Youth Network, has drafted the Pingelly Youth Strategy 2021-25 based on the ideas and contributions made by young people in the recent *Future Starts With 'You'th* Consultation series.

Through consultation and research, the Pingelly Youth Network established four focus areas to inform the scope of the Pingelly Youth Strategy 2021-25. The focus areas were determined based on:

- What matters most to young people
- Activities considered core business of the Shire
- Issues identified as having the greatest need or requiring the most attention
- Areas where the Shire can make the biggest impact or has influence

The focus areas are:

Strategies and actions for each focus area have been developed in considering the community and organisational capacity to deliver, to ensure the Pingelly Youth Strategy 2021-25 aligns to human and financial resource capabilities.

Next steps

The draft version of the Pingelly Youth Strategy 2021-25 is now available to view in-person at the Shire Office, or online from the Shire's website. The opportunity to submit any further feedback or comments will be open until Friday, 23 July at 4.30pm, to enable the Pingelly Youth Network and Council to consider any proposed changes in August 2021.
