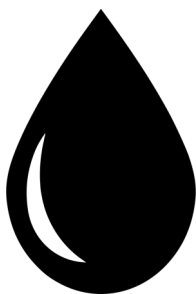

## COMMUNITY WATER SUPPLIES PARTNERSHIP

The Shire of Pingelly has just been approved for a grant of \$97,365 from the McGowan Government's Community Water Supplies Partnership Program with Local Government. This \$3.2 million Community Water Supplies Partnership Program is a collaborative program between the WA and Commonwealth Governments.



The Shire of Pingelly's Community Water Supply Project will expand and connect stormwater and wastewater reuse irrigation network in the town of Pingelly. A bore will be installed to reduce the reliance on scheme water and allow Pingelly to maintain turf conditions during dry summer months.

The Minister for Water Dave Kelly said "Congratulations to the Shires of Lake Grace, Pingelly, Wagin, and Woodanilling in securing this funding for their projects, which will help secure and boost water availability for their local communities. The Community Water Supplies Partnership Program grants will help these regional communities reduce their reliance on scheme water for non-potable needs."

The project will connect Memorial Park, Pioneer Park and the Town Oval to a bore via Realm Street Dam reducing the reliance on stormwater, ensuring that there is sufficient water available even during the summer months, and reducing the cost associated with reticulated potable water.
