

## **CEO'S REPORT**

2022 has been a busy and very productive year for the Shire of Pingelly. There are many projects have been completed, none of which could have been achieved without the hard work of our Shire staff. Some of the many projects that have been completed this year has been the work on our roads. The Shire has sealed sections of Wickepin-Pingelly Road; Yenelling Road; Pemberton Street; York-Williams Road; and Hall Street. In addition, thanks to our dedicated and knowledgeable staff our rural roads have substantially improved, although much more is to be done.

Other projects of note that have been completed this year include the restoration of the town's Entrance Signs; increased maintenance in the town centre; the installation of a Long Bay Parking area (behind Elder's); the digital sign in Memorial Park; the redevelopment of the Town Hall toilets; the receipt of the Sulkies and Buggies collection; the delivery of the Live and Local program to encourage local performing artists; recording local stories through the People of Pingelly project; and partnering with TAFE to provide local training for local people in the Early Childhood and Hospitality industries. Our work has been rewarded as Pingelly is a finalist in 4 categories of the Tidy Towns Awards – for the first time ever!

Other ongoing projects include the development of a Reconciliation Action Plan (commenced); Pingelly Arts and Culture Plan (nearing completion); the All Ages Shared Path – Stage 2 (commencing early 2023); Community Water Supply Program (commended); Heritage Inventory Review (nearing completion); and the Queens Commemorative Tree Planting (commenced).

The Shire has hosted many community events including Australia Day; Pingelly Country Collective; Youth Week; several Business BBQs to establish business networks; Anzac Day' Mothers Day Markets; International Womens Day; National Volunteer Week; National Reconciliation Week; National NAIDOC Week; Tutanning Wildflower Day; Seniors Week; and Pingelly Christmas Village. These have been well received and attended.

This year we have listened to your feedback, our community through the Pingelly Perception Survey which has led to new priorities of:

- Pingelly, the place to live, work, visit and invest
- Business growth
- High priority roads for local industry
- Housing & accommodation
- Inter-generational wellbeing

Converse with a Councillor has been introduced at 5:30pm on the third Wednesday of each month (after Council Meetings) so that we can continue to hear your feedback and ensure that we are working with you to deliver the community in which we all want to live.

The Shire office is closed from 23rd December until 3rd January. Until then, we wish you a very merry and safe Christmas and new year.
